SCHOOL READINESS

We have a Kindergarten Round Up in May to bring in our future students and get them registered. Before school starts, we have kinder assessment days to evaluate their incoming levels and readiness for school.

For all families, we hold our Open House before school starts so the students can see their classroom and meet their teachers before that first day of school. This helps with the first day nervousness and students know where to go and are familiar with their surroundings.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

We are a small rural school district that believes in success for every student. We will build in academic support for each student based on their needs.

Every elementary student has 45 minutes of ability based Walk to Read class in addition to the 60 minutes of core reading instruction. We formally assess all students using EasyCBM 3 times a year in addition to our 3rd through 5th graders taking the State Assessments.

Our academic program includes instruction in: literacy, mathematics, science, social studies, art, library, music, physical education, and STEM.

ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

Reading and Mathematics literacy are priorities of our academic program. In addition, we have a 1:1 technology initiative and a STEM/TEAMS initiative. It is our goal to build strong readers and mathematicians. These learners also need to be tech-savvy and able to navigate their way in the 21st century, every child has access to an Ipad (kinder through second grade) or Chromebook (3rd through 5th grade) to enrich their learning..

We are blessed to still have music, art, library, and physical education for all students.
