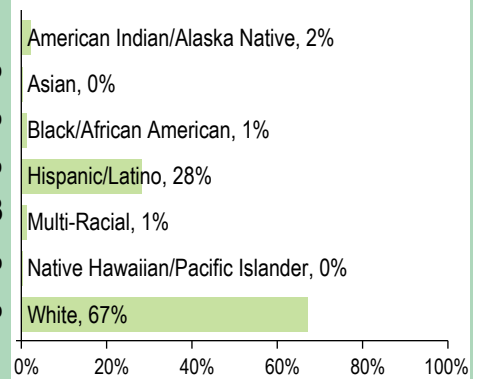

Performance of students enrolled in the school for a full academic year

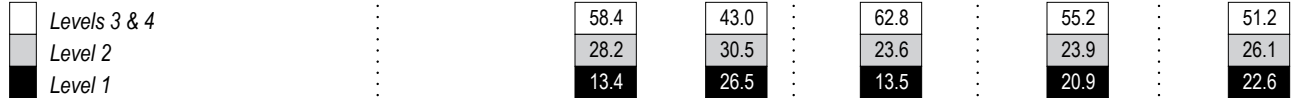

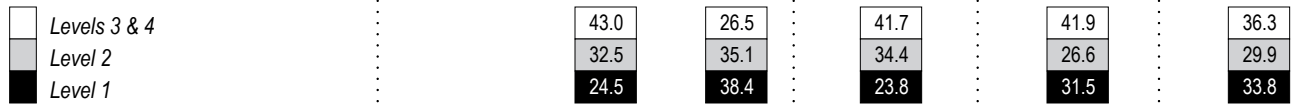

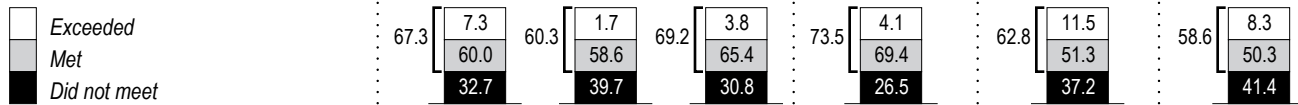
#### English Language Arts (Administered statewide in grades: 3-8, 11)
