A. Call to Order/Flag Salute

Chair, Mike Knepp opened the meeting with the flag salute at 6:30 p.m.

B. Approval of Agenda

Communication items 3 & 4 are being postponed to a later meeting; Anne Maloney will instead present information about the independent life skills program. Under the Business Agenda, item 1, board members should add policy KBA – Public Records to the list of updates. The proposed policy update was included in their board packet, but inadvertently left off the list in the agenda.

C. Communications

- 1) Hearing of Patrons –None.
- 2) Student Report Edwin Gutierrez and Avery Oppenlander were pleased to report the annual K-12 Food Drive brought in 917 items. Most impressive however, was that a higher quality of food was brought in this year. Plans are now underway for the GPA breakfast for all high school students with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or better. This event will be held after semester grades are posted. Students are preparing for FBLA and FFA competitions and winter sports teams continue to improve.
- 3) Mr. Kudlac asked permission for two presenters before moving on in the agenda. Nick Kidwell, Robotics Club Advisor, Jake Horat, Emma Hayes and Nico Navarro presented information about their club and actually gave a robotic demonstration with the robot they have designed and built. For being a novice team, they are competing at a very high level and may have a chance to partner with another team at the state competition. The board congratulated all who are involved and look forward to attending future competitions.
- 4) Mark Habliston, STEM Coach, reported on several projects in place this year: raising and releasing chinook salmon into the wild partnering with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife; Eagle Watch activities and live google mapping on an uninhabited island at the Cove Palisades Park; and outdoor activities at Mt. Bachelor.
- 5) Anne Maloney asked the board to travel to her classroom as she presented detailed information about her program and the high needs of our students at the Kinder and first grade level. It required a complete change in her program and included a physical re-structure of her classrooms. Extra staffing has also been required for these students.
- 6) Business Manager Report
 - J. Burleigh presented and reviewed the current financial statement. There was additional current and prior year property tax revenue as well as our expected payment from the state for a total of \$510,377 in revenue for December 2017. Under expenses, Mrs. Burleigh explained that Instructional Salary item is a bit higher because our billing from the High Desert ESD for substitutes is about two

months behind. The December expenses actually include substitutes from October. The need for substitutes is traditionally lower in September and begins to pick up considerably in October. This is a natural and expected increase in our expenses.

- 7) Administrator Reports
 - a) Michelle Zistel was absent.
 - b) Brad Kudlac & Josh Davis had two presentations earlier in the meeting.
 - c) Stefanie Garber handed out notes and highlights from the Educator Stakeholder Meeting with the Governor on January 9th. There were 18 other Superintendents in attendance and she was one of the presenters. Her two biggest take-aways from this meeting is that Culver is not alone in the increase of high need students at the kinder and first grade levels as well as an increase in kinder students arriving with little or no readiness skills. The second take-away is there is a huge teacher shortage in Oregon on the horizon. If hiring needs continue at their current level, the top 5 Oregon districts alone will need 3,000 teachers and the college system is only graduating 2,500 teacher candidates.
